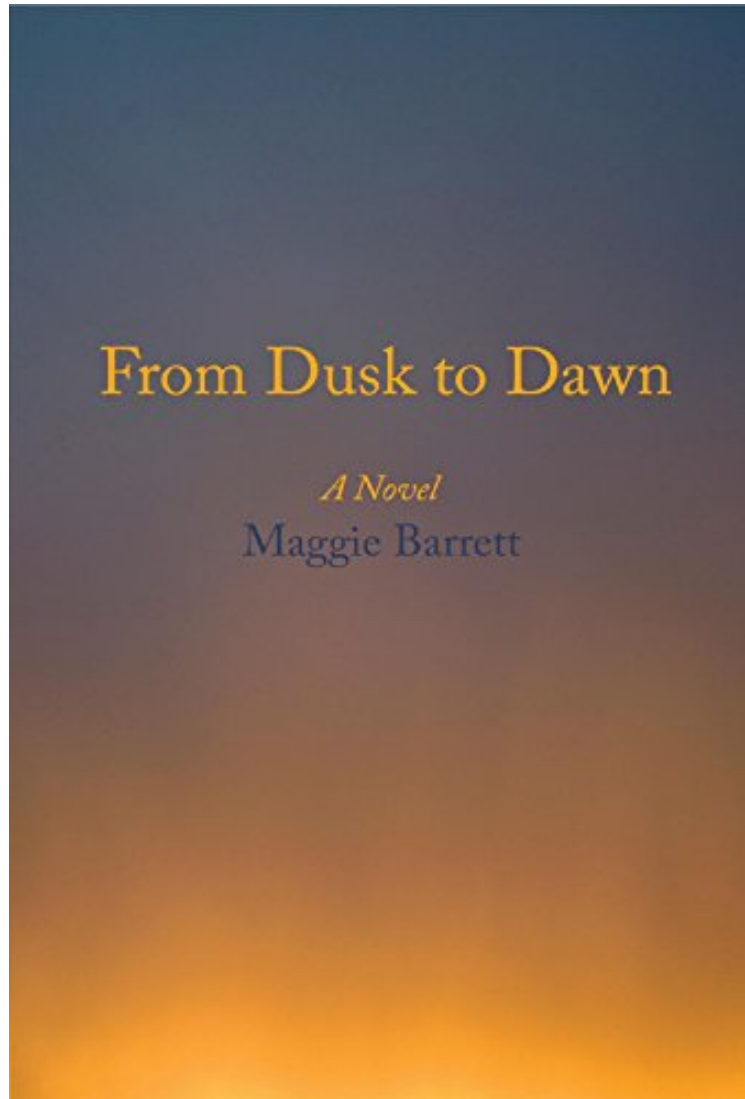

If you had to choose one thing to believe in and defend its validity in today's world, what would it be? In *From Dusk to Dawn* six characters trapped in an isolated inn on the edge of a cliff at the turn of the millennium make up a game to play until they're rescued. Reminiscent of Whor's *Afraid of Virginia Woolf* *From Dusk to Dawn* explores the nature of personal belief and its effect on strangers and loved ones. In the process, relationships teeter and family secrets are exposed. Over the course of twelve hours, a British ex-military man and his wife of thirty years, a New York surgeon and his artist lover, a recently jilted thirty-year-old lawyer and a twenty-year-old waitress who isn't always what she appears to be come to understand that belief often has nothing to do with truth. Literally a cliff-hanger, *From Dusk to Dawn* will keep you on the edge of your seat and inspire you to think about what you believe in as opposed to believing in what you think.
