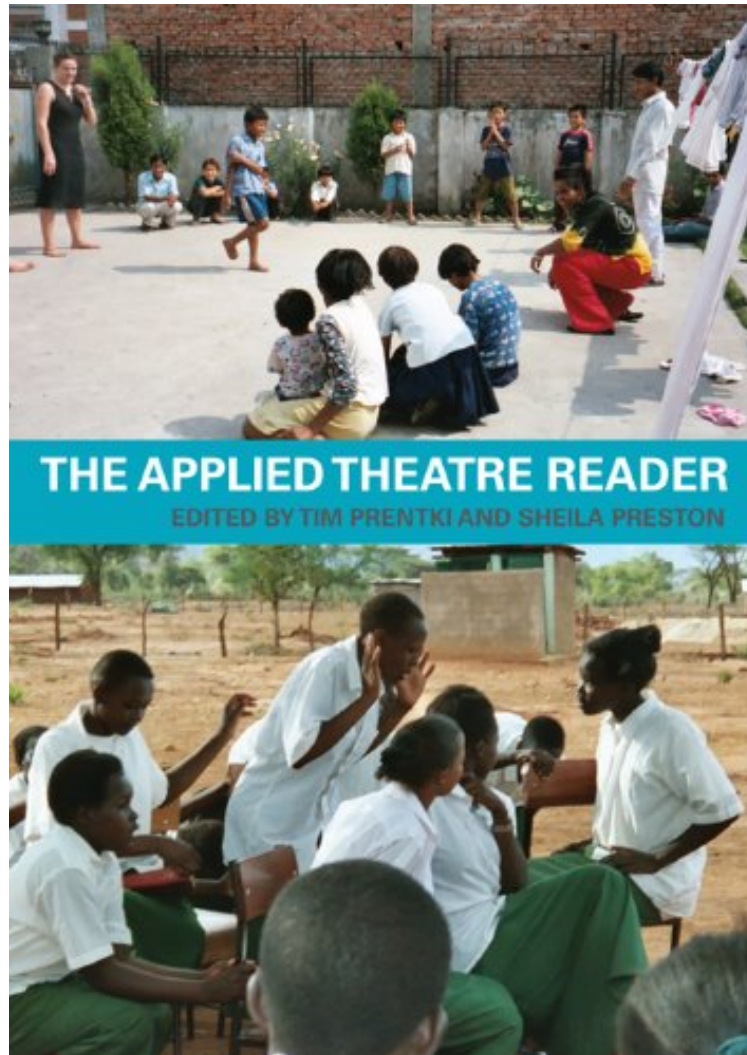

The Applied Theatre Reader is the first book to bring together new case studies of practice by leading practitioners and academics in the field and beyond, with classic source texts from writers such as Noam Chomsky, bell hooks, Mikhail

Bakhtin, Augusto Boal, and Chantal Mouffe. This book divides the field into key themes, inviting critical interrogation of issues in applied theatre whilst also acknowledging the multi-disciplinary nature of its subject. It crosses fields such as: theatre in educational settings, prison theatre, community performance, theatre in conflict resolution and reconciliation, interventionist theatre, theatre for development. This collection of critical thought and practice is essential to those studying or participating in the performing arts as a means for positive change.

About the Author Tim Prentki is Professor of Theatre for Development at the University of Winchester where he runs the MA in Theatre and Media for Development. He is co-author of *Popular Theatre in Political Culture* and is on the editorial board of *Research in Drama Education*.
