The Mayor has recently learned that an undercover inspector will soon join the ranks of the town's politicians in an attempt to unravel the town's tradition of self-serving and illegal politics. The rush to cover up their many discretions suddenly comes to a stop when the Mayor learns that the dreaded inspector has already arrived two weeks ago. This satirical play by Nikolai Vasilevich Gogol premiered after its playwright was already celebrated for his short stories. His sharp, witty analysis of government corruption remains among the wittiest satire to take on politics.

About the Author Nikolai Gogol was a Russian novelist and playwright born in what is now considered part of the modern Ukraine. By the time he was 15, Gogol worked as an amateur writer for both Russian and Ukrainian scripts, and then turned his attention and talent to prose. His short-story collections were immediately successful and his first novel, *The Government Inspector*, was well-received. Gogol went on to publish numerous acclaimed works, including *Dead Souls*, *The Portrait*, *Marriage*, and a revision of *Taras Bulba*. He died in 1852 while working on the second part of *Dead Souls*.
